

The Chapel of Breams




In the midst of the Garden is a small Chapel known as the Chapel of Dreams. This structure is patterned after a Spanish Mission Church, built in the year 1620.

The Chapel is one-fifth the size of the original mission church.

It is used for small weddings, meditation and prayer.

A pink stone at the altar is from the Horns of Hatten in the Holy Land, and comes from the mountain where Christ preached the Sermon on the Mount. On this stone couples, will stand when marriage ceremonies are performed.



The Carpenter Shop



The Shop is constructed of Kentucky stone, and gives the effect of a building as it would have been built two thousand years ago. The heavy doors are hand made, then scorched and oil treated. The beams are hand hewn.

The tools in the Carpenter's Shop are from Nazareth and are many hundreds of years old. They were given by Prime Minister Ben Gurion of Israel for the Garden of Hope. This illustrates how men of every faith — Jew and Gentile, Catholic and Protestant — recognizing its spiritual significance for all, have contributed toward its building.
