The Biblical Garden

Welcome to the Biblical Garden, a collection of plants mentioned in the writings of the Bible or thought to be growing at the eastern end of the Mediterranean Sea during Biblical times. Plants at that time were a very important part of the everyday lives of the people of that region, providing not only food, but medicine, fragrance, seasoning, clothing, shelter, and fuel. The importance of plants to these people is shown in the frequent reference to plants in the passages of the Bible quoted herein.

Today, many of these same plants can be found as relatively common garden plants, particularly in California where the climate matches the summer-dry climate of the eastern Mediterranean. Many of the biblical plants are still used for seasoning and fragrance.

At Strybing the Biblical Garden is located next to the Garden of Fragrance since many of the plants are repeated in each garden because of their fragrant flowers or aromatic foliage. The Biblical Garden plantings have been attractively landscaped to suggest the potential use of these plants in home landscapes.

Evergreen shrubs and groundcovers make up the majority of the plantings with seasonal interest provided by the flowering of fruit trees, perennials and bulbs. Annuals native to the biblical lands will be allowed to "naturalize" throughout the garden.

A NOTE ABOUT NAMES

There is still some confusion and controversy over the names of plants mentioned in the Bible, particularly with regard to the many plants referred to as "lilies" or "roses". In most instances, Moldenke's *Plants of the Bible* was followed. Recent authors have challenged some of his names, and as research continues into the plants of the Biblical lands, there will surely be further changes.





Annuals and bulbous plants have been included in the Biblical Garden as representatives of the vast array of wildflowers that colored the fields, valleys and mountainsides of the Biblical lands. They will not all be visible on any one visit to the Garden. Spring and early summer are the best times to see the widest range of these flowers.





Strybing Arboretum and Botanical Gardens, a "living museum of plants", is open to the public every day of the week from 8:00 am to 4:30 pm, and from 10:00 am to 5:00 pm on weekends. Located at 9th Ave. and Lincoln Way in Golden Gate Park, its main purpose is to educate the public about the beauty and importance of the plant world.
